BEAUTIFUL SAN FRANCISCO PARKS WITH PUBLIC RESTROOMS

Father Alfred E. Boeddeker Park 295 Eddy Street @ Jones

This inner-city sanctuary in the Tenderloin offers a basketball half-court, swings, slide and play structures. The community clubhouse hosts year-round activity programs.

Wander through the plaza to see its historic clock, kiln and two public sculptures. The globe created by Anthony Smith celebrates the area's diverse heritage, while Bruce Hassan's bronze "Ark" symbolizes the park as a safe haven for neighborhood families.

Opened in 1985, the park is named for beloved local pastor Father Alfred Boeddeker. Renovations are coming soon thanks to a grant from the Trust for Public Land.

Victoria Manalo Draves Park Folsom & Sherman St San Francisco, CA 94103

This brand new, 2-acre park is a welcome addition to the SOMA neighborhood, next to Bessie Carmichael School. With a softball field, basketball court, dual-level playground, picnic area, community garden and large, grassy field, there's enough space for everyone to come out and play.

The park is named for local diving champion Vicki Manalo Draves, the first Filipina-American to compete in the Olympic games. In 1948, she won two gold medals, in springboard and platform diving.

Dolores Park 19th & Dolores St

Encompassing more than 14 acres, Mission Dolores Park is one of San Francisco's most popular parks, the vibrant heart of its equally vibrant, culturally diverse neighborhood. Here you'll find lush green lawns shaded by tall palm trees, a soccer field, six tennis courts, one basketball court, a playground, a dog play area, and a clubhouse with recreational facilities and public restrooms. Many festivals, performances, and other cultural events are held here, and on sunny afternoons people flock to the park to play, picnic, lounge, walk their dogs, and enjoy spectacular views of the city's skyline and beyond. Named for nearby Mission Dolores, the park is situated on land that was once a Jewish cemetery. The City bought the property in 1905 and established the park. In 1906 it served as a refugee camp for more than 1,600 residents made homeless by the earthquake and fire.

Mission Playground 19th & Linda San Francisco, CA 94110

Join the fun on this busy, well-maintained playground or make a splash at the City's only outdoor pool. Two tennis courts, a basketball court and a blacktop soccer pitch are available for games. Relax on a bench or take stroll through the grassy area. The playground shares a site with the much-loved Mission Rec Center.
